Just by way of reasons and background, Member A, a member of The Law Society of Manitoba, was censured by a formal caution issued by the Society's Complaints Investigation Committee June 26, 1992, and what we had taken into consideration are the agreed statement of facts and those as elaborated on by Mr. Kravetsky.

Member A meets the application criteria for a pardon in that 10 years had passed since the date of censure, or point of caution, as applies in this case. Since that time there has been no other formal caution, and Member A has not been found guilty of any other charge of professional misconduct, or conduct unbecoming a lawyer.

There are no charges pending against

Member A. There are no complaints about her that are

under investigation, and there is no money owing to The Law

Society by the member. As well, the discipline panel has

not granted any previous application to Member Aunder

this rule...

Member A was called to the bar in Manitoba on June 26, 1979, and has been and remains a member of The Law Society of Manitoba. She was also called to the bar in the Province of Ontario May 14, 1981. Her practice history

is as set out, and in 2003 she became a non-practicing
member of The Law Society of Manitoba.

The formal caution that was issued to

Member A was benign, there was no loss or harm, and the

complaint was received by The Law Society of Manitoba after

that particular transaction was concluded. All monies had

been received as required by both of the parties in that

transaction.

Twenty-three and a half years have passed since the censure, and there is nothing that The Law Society would speak to against that pardon and, in fact, The Law Society of Manitoba in this particular application is in agreement with the application, and has pointed out that there is nothing in Member A's professional or public life known to the Society that would speak against a pardon, and that her clear record in the 23 years since the censure, the particular facts of the matter for which she was censured, and her prior clean record are such that in the absence of any other matters reflecting poorly on her character it is fair to conclude that the censure no longer reflects adversely on her character.

In fact, as Mr. Kravetsky has pointed out,

Member A has, in her personal life, been actively

involved both on boards and in a volunteer capacity in an

active way.
